

# AGILA-HAVEN Program Turned-Over Livelihood Assistance to 140 Former Violent Extremists

total of 140 Former Violent Extremists from the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF) and Daulah Islamiya who surrendered to the government received livelihood and farm assistance on February 16, 2022 at the 6th Infantry Division Grounds, Camp Siongco, Awang, Datu Odin Sinsuat, Maguindanao.

The event was possible through the Province of Maguindanao's peace initiative program known as Anak Na May Glnintuang Layunin, Upang Hintuan Ang Violent Extremism Ngayon (AGILA-HAVEN).

Maguindanao Governor, Bai Mariam Sangki-Mangundadatu led the simple turn-over ceremony.

Other attendees include Major General Juvymax Uy, Joint Task Force Central and 6th Infantry Division Commander, Secretary Delfin Lorenzana, Department of National Defense Secretary, ASec Alexander Macario, Department of Interior and Local Government Assistant Secretary, Lieutenant General Alfredo Rosario, Commander of Western Mindanao Command, Hon. Suharto Mangundadatu, Governor of Sultan Kudarat Province, and the other Officers and Men of the Kampilan Division.

The Maguindanao Governor extended her heartfelt gratitude to the 6ID Commander and to the PNP for their unwavering support to the Maguindanao Province in terms of peace and security.

She also lauded the former violent extremists' decision to return to the folds of law. # CGPA GRACES THE INAUGURATION OF 6ID KAMPILAN GOLF COURSE






### 6ID ADC **PRESIDES 12FPAO CHANGE** OF CHIEF OF OFFICE

# INJURED NPA COMBATANT SURRENDERS TO GOVERNMENT TROOPS IN SOUTH COTABATO



n injured member of the Communist Terrorist Group (CTG), identified as Ricky Lumbay alias Jeric, voluntarily surrendered with his caliber 5.56 M16A1 Carbine Rifle to the 11th Special Forces Company, 5th Special Forces Battalion (5SFBn) and to the Local Government Unit of T'Boli, South Cotabato on January 31, 2022.

Brigadier General Pedro Balisi Jr. disclosed that alias "Jeric" was among the CTG members encountered by government troops at Brgy Tudok, T'Boli, South Cotabato during the combat operations launched last January 5, 2022 wherein 6 NPA terrorists were believed to be wounded based on the testimonies of some witnesses.

Alias Jeric narrated that he was left injured by other NPA members during the armed clash last January 5, 2022. "Noong narinig naming nagputukan na, tumalon ako sa bangin, yung mga kasama ko nagtakbuhan na rin, lalo na narinig nila yung helicopter. Napilay at nasugatan ako dahil sa pagtalon ko sa bangin," alias Jeric said. "Naligaw ako sa aking mga kasama, pagod, gutom at masakit ang aking katawan kaya gumawa ako ng paraan para makalapit sa mga tao at magsurrender," he added.

Residents from the sitios of Motosom, Salabanog and Mangga of Brgy. Laconon, T'Boli, South Cotabato immediately reported to authorities the presence of alias Jeric. It can be recalled that said communities were among the barangays that received help through the Community Support Program (CSP) and Retooled Community Support Program (RCSP) conducted by the Local Government Unit of T'Boli and the 5th SFBn.

Mayor Dibu S. Tuan expressed that the NTF-ELCAC mechanisms are effective because of the recent surrenders of CTG Local Guerilla Units/Milisyang Bayan and NPA terrorist members from October 2021 to date. "Our conduct of CSP and RCSP is gaining grounds and it must be sustained. These development-oriented approaches coupled with the AFP and PNP's peace, law enforcement, and development support activities and combat operations is a good practice that every LGU must adopt and sustain", Hon. Mayor Tuan said.

The LGU of T'Boli provided the surrenderee with immediate medical and financial assistance. Further, he will be enrolled in the Enhanced Comprehensive Local Integration Program (E-CLIP) as part of the overall government program for those CTG members who returned to the folds of the law.

Major General Juvymax Uy, Commander of the Joint Task Force Central and the 6th Infantry Division commended the Local Government Unit for their countless efforts in implementing the NTF-ELCAC which positively resulted in the peaceful surrenders and combat encounters against the CTGs in South Cotabato.

"With the help of the LGUs and the communities, the defeat of the CTG is inevitable. The recent surrenders of CTG members and the accomplishments of the NTF-ELCAC, our efforts towards peace are gaining grounds and will be realized in the near future".

### "WATER FOR PEACE" INSTALLED TO SUPPORT HIGHLAND COMMUNITY IN SK



he 7th Infantry (TAPAT) Battalion pursues its genuine services in carrying out its mandate to Ending Local Communist Armed Conflict (ELCAC) through the conduct of Community Support Program (CSP) in the Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas (GIDAs) in the unit's area of operations.

To address the primary issues raised during the immersion of CSP Team, the unit spearheaded the installation of a hydraulic ram pump as a component project of the Community Empowerment Thru Science and Technology (CEST) that will provide quality potable water to the highland community.

Institutionalizing the Whole of Nation Approach in attaining inclusive and sustainable peace, the 7IB involved different concerned agencies with their respective mandate as follows: DOST XII to provide technical assistance and facilitate the acquisition/fabrication and installation of a hydraulic ram pump,

DOLE XII to provide emergency employment to the fifteen (15) manpower under the Tulong Panghanap-buhay sa Ating Disadvantaged/Displaced Worker (TUPAD) Program and LGU from provincial down to municipal and barangay levels to provide necessary assistance for the day to day operations of the said project.

The signing of the Memorandum of Agreement and Groundbreaking of the Hydraulic Ram Pump was launched to formally start the said project at Sitio Spur 2, Barangay Titulok, Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat.

The unit's mandate of uplifting the socioeconomic status of the geographically isolated and conflict-affected barangays counters the propaganda of the Communist Terrorist Groups (CTGs) against the government. Thus, winning the sympathy of the community towards progressive peace and development.

Major General Juvymax Uy, Commander of the Joint Task Force Central and the 6th Infantry Division lauded the troops for their professionalism and dedication to carry out their mission of protecting the communities and the Filipino people from the atrocities of the terrorist groups. "If these terrorists were left unchecked, they could possibly attack civilian populace that may result to loss of lives and damage of properties", Maj. Gen. Uy said.

According to Lieutenant Colonel Raymond Rapi, Battalion Commander of the operating troops, the firefight lasted for about five (5) minutes which led to the neutralization of two (2) DI-MG terrorists identified as Zypol Nilong and Salahudin Usman believed to be under Zaiden Jade Nilong alias Aliboy. The armed clash also resulted to the seizure of two (2) M16 rifles, various components in making improvised explosive devices (IED), and several subversive documents and war materials.

Brigadier General Pedro Balisi Jr, Commander of the 1st Mechanized Brigade, disclosed that the operating troops are continuously conducting pursuit operating troops are continuously conducting parson operations against other DI terrorists who were able to escape. "Our forces will continue to hunt down the remnants of this terrorist group in order to prevent them in attacking our communities. Through the intensified military operations conducted by the JTF Central troops, coupled with the cooperation of the LGUs and the community, the series of successes of these operations indicates that the Daulah Islamiya Terorist Group is nearing its end", Brig. Gen. Balisi Jr said.

October 29, 2021, military forces killed Salahuddin Hasan, the known Emir of DI Philippines in an armed clash at Talayan, Maguindanao along with his wife, Jehana Minbida, the Finance Officer of the group. On December 1, 2021, the son of DI Subleader Hasan Indal, identified as alias Adsam, was neutralized by JTF Central forces in Brgy Ganta, Shariff Saydona Mustapha, Maguindanao. A day after, the newly appointed Emir and leader of DI Terrorist Group, identified as a certain Asim Karinda alias Abu Azim together with four (4) followers, were killed in an armed clash with the JTF Central forces at the nearby town of Mamasapano. In addition, the DI Emir for military affairs identified as Norodin Hasan alias Andot along with his three (3) followers were also killed on January 15, 2022 during a massive man hunt operation by the JTF Central forces in Carmen, North Cotabato in pursuit to the mastermind and individuals responsible for the Mindanao Star bus bombing in Aleosan, North Cotabato on January 11, 2022.

Major General Juvymax Uy continues to call on the remaining members of the DI to surrender to the government and live peaceful lives with the community. "As much as possible, we want to give them (DI Terrorists) a chance to live in peace with their families. Surrender and the government will help you build and start your new lives peacefully, otherwise the JTF Central forces will not stop in hunting you".

### Mastermind of Aleosan, North Cotabato Bus Bombing Killed in an Encounter with Philippine Army Forces

ive (5) days after the tragic Mindanao Star bus bombing along the national highway of Aleosan, North Cotabato, the Philippine Army forces of the 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division neutralized the mastermind and the three (3) other extremists responsible for bombing during a manhunt operation in Carmen, North Cotabato on January 15, 2022.

Major General Juvymax Uy, Commander of the Joint Task Force Central and the 6th Infantry Division, identified the mastermind as a certain Norodin Hassan alias Andot, the known Emir for Military Affairs of the Daulah Islamiya Hassan Group (DI-HG). "The death of alias Andot and three (3) of his cohorts gives justice to the victims of the Mindanao Star bus bombing", Maj. Gen. Uy said.

It can be recalled that on January 11, 2022, an improvised explosive device was set off inside a Mindanao Star bus unit while plying along the national highway of Aleosan, North Cotabato, killing a 5-year-old child and wounding six (6) other passengers.

Philippine Army and Police Explosive and Ordnance Disposal Teams conducted a Sensitive Site Exploitation and Post Blast Investigation immediately after the incident to identify the suspects. Intelligence reports and information from the civilian populace helped the security forces track down the perpetrators and launched a massive manhunt operation a day after the explosion.

Col. Jovencio Gonzales, Commander of the 602nd Brigade identified two (2) of the three (3) associates of alias Andot as Abdonillah Hassan alias Don and Abdonhack Hassan alias Abdon, while another one is yet to be identified. Several firearms and war materials were seized from the suspects which includes one (1) 7.62mm M14 Rifle, one (1) cal. 30 M1 Garand Rifle, several rounds of ammunition and magazines of different calibers, analog cellphones, solar panels, ICOM radios, and other subversive documents with high intelligence value.

"After identifying the perpetrators who were responsible for the bombing attack, we immediately launched the manhunt operation in order to prevent them from doing similar atrocities in other areas to prevent further loss of lives and damage to properties", Col. Gonzales said.

Since the last quarter of 2021, several high-ranking Daulah Islamiya personalities have been neutralized by the 6ID forces namely: Salahuddin Hassan, Emir of Daulah Islamiya — Philippines was neutralized by government forces in Talayan, Maguindanao on October 29, 2021; alias Adsam, Sub-Leader of DI, was neutralized on December 1, 2021, at Datu Salibo, Maguindanao; and Asim Karinda alias Abu Azim, newly appointed Emir of DI, was killed in an encounter with the government forces on December 2, 2021, at Mamasapano, Maguindanao.

"Our continuous effort to go after these terrorist groups has been unyielding. There will be no let-up and slowing down against these terrorists attack civilian continue to populace, properties, and communities. these accomplishments were realized with the help of the local leaders members and the communities".

"Together let us stand against these terrorist groups. In due time we will defeat them and the people of Central Mindanao will finally realize the peace and security that they longed for."

he 34th Infantry (Reliable) Battalion schemed accomplishments involving peace building that results in gaining positive remarks. A total of twenty nine (29) former members of BIFF both from Bungos and Karialan factions in the municipalities of Midsayap, North Cotabato and Northern Kabuntalan, Maguindanao were presented by Lt. Col Edgardo L. Vilchez Jr. PA, Commanding Officer of 34th IB to Col. Jovencio F. Gonzalez PA, Commander of 602nd Brigade, 6ID, PA and to the municipal mayors of Midsayap and Northern Kabuntalan. Twenty eight (28) among them are from the municipality of Midsayap, North Cotabato including one (1) PSR listed known as "Seok Panday" and one (1) from Northern Kabuntalan, Maguindanao. During the course of custodial debriefing of the surrenderees, it was found that two of them were child warriors with ages 16 and 17 years old.

The surenderees surrendered their high powered firearms and ammunitions composed of: One (2) M16 rifle with one (1) magazine and six (6) live ammos, One (1) M1 garand rifle with three (3) ammunitions, One (1) M14 rifle with one (1) magazine, Two (2) modified Caliber 50 barret sniper rifle with five (5) live ammunitions, One (1) 7.62mm modified barret sniper rifle with one (1) magazine, One (1) Caliber 45 with one (1) magazine and three (3) live ammos, Two (2) M79 with two (2) Ctg 40mm HE ammos, and Two (2) homemade rocket-propelled grenade (RPG) with two (2) RPG HEAT ammos as a gesture of whole hearted commitment to abandon violence. This strongly indicates that the said BALIK-LOOB BIFF's aim a new beginning and finally support government advocacies.

As part of the unit's Civil-Military works in response to the typhoon "Odette", 34IB partnered with the different organizations such as PCACV, Great Midsayap Lady Eagles Club, Rotary Club of Midsayap Chapter and Midsayap Masters Events Supplier Association (MMESA). Despite of being outside of the unit's area of operation, it still provided area security and humanitarian assistance during the distribution of relief goods to the affected families in Brgy Mabua, Surigao City.

Lt. Col. Vilchez Jr. and Col. Gonzales witnessed the Groundbreaking Ceremony for the Construction of Public Market held at Brgy

Kapinpilan, Midsayap, Cotabato. This public market will serve as a foundation of an improving community that can provide business opportunities to sustain the needs of the people and support the growth of trade and industry.

Path to lasting peace was made when the 34TH Infantry (RELIABLE) Battalion of the 6th Infantry (KAMPILAN) Division, Philippine Army based at Barangay Salunayan, Midsayap, Cotabato under Lt. Col Vilchez Jr., Commanding Officer of the unit witnessed the final settlement of a long-time feud between Kulilong, Mamisel Families and Mangadta, Embalgan Families in Barangay Mudseng, Midsayap, Cotabato. The highlight was started by the reading of the Qur'an and Raising the Flags of the Philippines and BARMM Government followed by signing of the Peace and Reconciliation between parties. The RIDO had already caused too much suffering and miseries for both parties as armed confrontation erupted in many instances between them that resulted to series of forced evacuation among innocent civilians and to the extent that resulted to loss of lives and damage of properties. The unit assisted the peaceful negotiation and showed neutral judgement to acquire a fair decision prior to the settlement.

During the 34lB's celebration of its 48th Founding Anniversary, "Stakeholders Night" was conducted to give thanks and appreciation to all stakeholders for their invaluable support and assistance rendered to this unit in its over-all mission accomplishment during the incumbency of Lt. Col. Vilchez Jr. The activity aims to maintain strong relationship and active support from key stakeholders in the area.

The 34IB has its own language and channel of communication in analyzing differences of ethnic groups, cultures and religious beliefs. The idea of constructing Musalla inside camp is to ensure the spiritual growth of its personnel. The successful opening was done through simple ribbon cutting ceremony followed by Sambayang and Kanduli at the battalion headquarters in connection with the unit's celebration of its 48th Founding anniversary.

### CONTINUOUS CAMPAIGNS AGAINST TERRORIST GROUPS YIELD 23 SURRENDEREES IN CENTRAL MINDANAO

total of twenty-three (23) former violent extremists yield to the Joint Task Force Central (JTFC) forces in North Cotabato and Maguindanao Provinces on January 21, 2022 bringing along with them 21 high-powered firearms and several improvised explosive devices.

Major General Juvymax Uy, Commander of the JTFC and the 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division disclosed that the single-day surrender belongs to several local terrorist groups in different areas of Central Mindanao: six (6) combatants from the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF) Karialan Faction and two (2) from the Daulah Islamiya (DI) Turaife Group surrendered to 90th Infantry Battalion in Pikit, North Cotabato; three (3) combatants from the BIFF Karialan Faction and two (2) from DI Hassan Group surrendered to 90IB in Pagalungan, North Cotabato and ten (10) from the BIFF-Bungos Faction surrendered to the 1st Mechanized Battalion in Ampatuan, Maguindanao.

"This is the result of JTFC's continuous campaign against the terrorist groups in order to protect our communities from their atrocities and to achieve long and lasting peace in this part of the country", Maj. Gen. Uy stressed.

The recent surrender raised the total number of former violent extremists who returned to the folds of the law to 53 since the start of the Calendar Year 2022.

Lieutenant Colonel Rommel Mundala, Commanding Officer of the 90IB disclosed that the nine (9) former violent extremists who surrendered in Pikit, North Cotabato brought along one (1) Cal. 30 Machine gun, two (2) M16 Rifles, three (3) M14 Rifles, one (1) RPG2 and one (1) grenade-type IED. These were presented to Colonel Donald Gumiran, 602nd Brigade Deputy Commander and to Hon Sumulong Sultan, Mayor of Pikit, North Cotabato.

The five (5) other former violent extremists who surrendered in Pagalungan brought along two (2) M14 Rifles, one (1) Ultimax 5.56mm machine gun, one (1) RPG2, and one (1) 7.62mm Barret Rifle. These were presented to Colonel Gumiran and to Hon Salik Mamasabulod, Mayor of Pagalungan, North Cotabato.

In addition, Lieutenant Colonel Cresencio Sanchez Jr., Commanding Officer of the 1st Mechanized Battalion said that the ten (10) former BIFF combatants who surrendered in Ampatuan, Maguindanao brought along with them one (1) US Cal .30 M1919A4 Browning Machine Gun, one (1) US M1 Carbine Rifle, one (1) US M14 Rifle, one (1) US M14 Rifle, one (1) Garand Rifle, and four (4) Homemade 7.62mm Sniper Rifles. These were presented to Colonel Ferdinand Lacadin, 1st Mechanized Brigade Officer In Charge and to Hon. Unson Demaguil, Executive Secretary of Datu Salibo, Maguindanao.

These surrenderees are set to be enrolled under the DIWATA-HAVEN Program of North Cotabato and AGILA-HAVEN of Maguindanao Province.

"The successful surrender of these 23 former violent extremists were realized through the joint efforts of the JTFC forces and the local PNP units of Pikit, Pagalungan, and Datu Salibo".

"The security landscape in Central Mindanao will definitely change these accomplishments sustained. I continue to call on our partners in the Local Government Units, government and government agencies and organizations, stakeholders, and of the communities to members continue helping the JTFC in our to totally defeat violent extremism in Central Mindanao. Our your gains aains are and our accomplishments are accomplishments. We will defeat these terrorist groups in due time."

he Local Government Unit of T'Boli, South Cotabato along with the Indigenous Peoples' Community of T'Boli vowed to end the Communist Terrorist Group's exploitations in their community as they support the surrender of two (2) NPA Terrorists to the 11th Special Forces Company, 5th Special Forces Battalion under the 1st Mechanized Infantry Brigade, 6th Infantry Division, Philippine Army on February 4, 2022.

Both surrenderees are members of the Indigenous Peoples (IPs) from the T'Boli tribe in South Cotabato.

T'Boli Mayor Dibu S. Tuan said that through the mechanisms of the National Task Force on Ending Local Communist Armed Conflict (NT-ELCAC), he vows to save the IP communities from the exploitation of the CPP/NPA/NDF while declaring that the terror group's ideology is the poison that destroys the culture and tradition of the IPs.

The government troops assure the South Cotabato province of their best efforts to quell any terrorist threats to support and sustain the peace and development programs and projects and the continuous delivery of basic and social services particularly in the conflict-affected areas.

Brigadier General Pedro Balisi Jr., Commander of 1st Mechanized Infantry Brigade, acknowledges the role of the LGU and the IP communities in quelling communist terrorism in T'Boli, South Cotabato, and continues to urge the cooperation of the entire community to support the TF-ELCAC of the said municipality. "The surrender of alias Dagul, as a political guide, is a big loss to GF MUSA. With this accomplishment, we are expecting more surrenders in the next few days", Brig. Gen. Balisi said.

Furthermore, Major General Juvymax R Uy lauded the efforts of the 11th SF Company, 5th SF Battalion, the LGU of T'Boli, South Cotabato and the T'Boli IP Community in crushing the CTG exploitation in the said town. "We are one with you in protecting your communities and families from the atrocities and exploitations of the CTGs", Maj. Gen. Uy said. He reiterated his call for the remaining communist terrorists to surrender and return to the folds of the law. "Those who refused to surrender, there will be no let-up and the government will be relentless in hunting you down."

hrough collaboration with the Local Government Units of General Santos City, two (2) former Communist Terrorists and a Dawlah Islamiya Extremist who decided to return to the folds of law and live a peaceful life, received additional financial assistance worth Php 15,000.00 pesos each through the City Social Development Office of General Santos City Sustainable Development Program on February 24, 2022. Among the beneficiaries were Rudin Embang @Rod Former Violent Extremist (FVEs), Nico A Balansi @Bentong, and Rene Kansal Ahim @ Baldo Former Rebels (FRs).

It can be recalled that on October 06, 2021 the surrenderees were presented to the media by COL GALILEO GOYENA JR MNSA (CAV) PA, Task Force Gensan Commander and have received initial financial assistance and livelihood packages from the Local Government Units. Also presented were the surrendered firearms which includes one (1) Remington 5.56mm R4 rifle, one (1) caliber 30 Springfield Garand rifle, and one (1) caliber .45 pistol.

COL GALILEO GOYENA JR MNSA (CAV) PA, Task Force Gensan Commander, disclosed that the former Dawlah Islamiya Extremist belongs to the DI-Hassan Group operating in Polomolok, South Cotabato while the two former communist terrorists were from SRC Daguma, FSMR operating in the municipalities of Kalamansig, Palimbang and Lebak.

The said surrenderees are undergoing custodial debriefing and are being processed under the Enhanced Comprehensive Local Integration Program (E-CLIP) of the national government for the additional aid. The surrenderees claimed that they are already tired of running and hiding away from government forces and that they have no more place to hide since the people have been reportedly tipping off their presence or location to authorities. They also handed over their firearms to prove their sincere intent to abandon their armed struggle.



# 10 BIFF FIGHTERS YIELD 9 ASSORTED FIREARMS TO LAKAN BATTALION


### CSP-PCVE, Tool of 6IB towards Peace and Development

The activity was attended by 215 aspiring youth leaders of said barangays who are willing to develop their skills, change their perception, and achieve their dreams. The LGU of South Upi laid out its plan to continue in conducting the said activity in the different barangays of the said municipalities for the entire calendar year 2022.

Likewise in the internal aspect, the PCRVE trained personnel of the 6th CMO Battalion continues to impart knowledge on PCRVE to the personnel of the different Organic and OPCON units of Joint Task Force Central and 6ID, PA during the conduct of CSP-PCVE In-House Trainings.

On the other hand, on the effort of Civic Action to the GIDAs, the 6th CMO Battalion continuously supports and collaborates with the partner stakeholders to bring the basic services to its constituents. From 27 February to 01 March 2022, the unit provided manpower assistance to Maguindanao LGU during the conduct of Medical and Surgical Mission in the different barangays of the municipality of Datu Blah Sinsuat, Maguindanao. # The Significant Efforts of the 549th Engineer **"Kapayapaan" Battalion**

he 549th Engineer (KAPAYAPAAN)
Battalion, 54th Engineer (SARANGAY)
Brigade strongly adheres and supports all

operations of JTF Central. The major activities are
carried out in collaboration with stakeholders and
other government agencies to make unchartered
territories of Central Mindanao, a highway of

The Engineer Civic Action Projects (ENCAPs), construction of ten (10) housing units for the Former Rebels (FR) is nearing completion which is executed through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the National Housing Authority (NHA-XII), the Provincial Government of Sultan Kudarat, the Local Government of Senator Ninoy Aquino, the 7IB and the 549EB. Another equally important project is the on-going construction of a Joint Peace and Security Team (JPST) facilities through the OPPAP-AFP Supplemental Memorandum of Agreement (MOA). This will confidently harmonize and sustain peace among members of the MILF, BIFF, AFP and PNP. The stations can be found at Brgy Kuya, South Upi, Maguindanao and Sitio Pansol, Brgy Macasampen, Guindulongan, Maguindanao.

The Battalion is also part of the successful completion of the Cotabato Airport Development Project (CADP) Runway Strip Grade Correction, wherein the unit provided engineering capabilities to support the project execution. It has a total of

450-calendar day timeline, but was completed within 289 calendar days.

The unit's Disaster Response and Rescue Operations (DRRO) team was also able to make significant accomplishments like the Retrieval Operation of a human body trapped in a mountain cave of Sitio Nabilan, Dinaig, DOS, Maguindanao on July 28, 2021. The joint efforts of the 549Ebn DRO, the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) of DOS led by SFO4 Hazel L Saavedra, PLT Guiseppe Q Tamayo of PNP-DOS, PDRRMO led by Datu Nasrullah Imam, CDRRMO-Cotabato, MDRRMO-DOS and the BLGU of Dinaig painstakingly exerted effort to ensure the success of the operation.

he Philippine Army (PA) is the main, oldest and largest branch of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), responsible for ground warfare with an estimated 48 million available military manpower and at least 280,000 military personnel, ranked 51st among 140 countries in terms of military strength in 2022.

The service branch was established on December 21, 1935 as the Philippine Commonwealth Army. The Philippine Army has engaged in many conflicts including the ongoing Communist Rebellion in the Philippines, the Moro Conflict and, alongside other national military forces, in conflicts of international scope.

After the establishment of the Commonwealth, Manuel L. Quezon, the first president, sought the services of General Douglas MacArthur to evolve a national-defense plan. On December 21, 1935, the Philippine Army was established. The act set forth the organizational structure of the army and enlistment and mobilization procedures.

The onset of World War II in 1941 tested the might of the Commonwealth Philippine Army. Its two (2) regular and 10 reserve divisions undertook the defense of the Philippines. These divisions were incorporated into the United States Armed Forces in the Far East (USAFFE) under the command of General Douglas McArthur.

After the war, four military areas were activated. The National Defense Forces which were



organized under the National Defense Act was reorganized into the Armed Forces of the Philippines which came the birth of four major services.

On July 10, 1957, the Philippine Army established its headquarters under the leadership of Brigadier General Leoncio S. Tan. The role of the Philippine Army expanded in the sixties, to include participation in the socio-economic programs of the country, among others. In the seventies, in order to achieve greater flexibility and effectiveness, infantry divisions took the place of the military areas.

On September 21, 1972, the Martial Law era began. During the decade, military operations supported by civic action blocked the escalation of insurgency. The 1980s saw the Philippine Army in increasing peace and development roles and in a period of transition after the EDSA-People Power Revolution, which spurred various initiatives toward transformation and reforms in internal security operations. The Philippine Army became more cognizant of its role not only as protector of the Filipino people, but also a partner in nation building.

Today, the Philippine Army celebrates its 125 years of relentless service to the Filipino people, government's whole-of-nation supporting the approach against insurgency led by the National Task Force to End the Local Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-ELCAC). The Army provides efficient instrument and structure for the employment of the whole-of-nation approach and also assists in the implementation of the Enhanced Comprehensive Local Integration Program (ECLIP) offered to former rebels. These efforts complement the Army's sustained anti-terrorism operations on the ground.
