ajor General Roy M Galido PA has been formally assumed as the new Commander of the 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division, replacing same Major General Roberto S Capulong in a 40th Change of Command Ceremony held on August 11, 2022 at Headquarters 6ID (H6ID), Awang, DOS, Maguindanao.

Maj. Gen. Galido, a versatile Army Officer, served as the Army's Vice Commander, Acting Chief of Staff, and was formerly an Army Inspector General prior to his assumption, and he vowed to build more on the gains of his predecessor.

Meanwhile, during Maj. Gen. Capulong's brief tenure as Acting Commander, 6ID plays an important role in the overall peace, security, and development initiatives in the current operating environment. "Our efforts are geared towards building on the significant achievements to accomplish our mission aligned with the intent of the Higher Headquarters," Maj. Gen. Capulong said.

The change of command was presided over by Lieutenant General Romeo S Brawner Jr., Commanding General of the Philippine Army, as Guest Speaker. The ceremony was also attended by the former Commanders of 6ID, selected guests, visitors, Army Officers, and personnel due to the DOH's minimum health protocols implemented in the midst of the pandemic's personal the personal time and the personal due to the pandemic's

onslaught. Hence, a live stream was provided through social media for the stakeholders to witness the said activity.

In his speech, Lt. Gen. Brawner Jr. commended Maj. Gen. Capulong for his achievements and even outlined the accomplishments of the 6th Infantry Division during his short stint as the Acting Commander of Kampilan Division. "He has supervised the conduct of

purposive military operations against the Local and Communist Terrorist Groups, which resulted in the neutralization of some enemy personalities, including high-ranking members. Further, he has also facilitated the voluntarily surrender of several Former Rebels to the mainstream society," Lt. Gen. Brawner said.

Both MGEN Galido and MGEN Capulong belonged to the Philippine Military Academy's "Bigkis Lahi" Class of 1990.

Maj. Gen. Galido is no stranger to the area of operations of the 6ID, having been assigned here during the early years of his military career. That is why he is also tagged as a full-blooded Kampilan Army Officer. His previous assignments include Commander of the 601st Infantry Brigade; Commander of the Anti-Kidnapping Joint Task Force Tugis; and Battalion Commander of the 40th and 38th Infantry Battalions, all under the command of the 6ID, among others.

In his message, Maj. Gen. Galido thanked his predecessor, his "mistah," for being his "John the Baptist." He also asserted that he will continue to work with Local Chief Executives and stakeholders to uphold peace, security, and tranquility in the area. He also reiterated his command philosophy: **discipline**, **healthy lifestyle**, **and family**. In his concluding remarks, he borrowed an adage from former President FVR, "Kaya natin to."

eep up the good work." These are the words that were embedded in the speech of President and Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Philippines, Ferdinand "Bong-Bong" R. Marcos Jr., during his visit to Camp Siongco, Awang, DOS, Maguindanao on September 15, 2022.

Major General Roy M. Galido, Commander of Joint Task Force Central and 6ID, welcomed the President, along with Chief of Staff, Armed Forces of the Philippines Lieutenant General Bartolome Vicente O Bacarro; and Commander of Western Mindanao Command, Lt. Gen. Alfredo V. Rosario Jr., at the home of the Kampilan Troopers, where the country's highest official was also accorded with military honors upon his arrival at the 6ID Headquarters.

The President was elated with the accomplishments of the Command in peace efforts within Central and South-Central Mindanao, which paved the way for the bolstering of economic activities in the region.

In his message, the President urged the Officers and Enlisted Personnel of the 6ID to act morally and do the right thing to uphold peace and order in this part of Mindanao. The President made the statement in a brief "talk to the troops" held at the 6ID grandstand in the afternoon.

Meanwhile, MGen. Galido also presented to the President the Confiscated, Captured, surrendered and Recovered (CCSR) firearms seized by the soldiers in their various peace efforts and military operations.

The President also understands that, despite the minor changes, the entire armed forces were doing a good job, and he believes that the army will easily adjust and accept, as they always do.

On the same day, prior to his visit to 6ID, the Chief Executive also graced the inauguration of the Bangsamoro Transition Authority (BTA) 2022-2025 in a ceremony at the Shariff Kabunsuan Cultural Complex located within the Bangsamoro Government Center in Cotabato City.

Following Republic Act No. 11593, which extends the transition period in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) until 2025, he had earlier appointed 80 new members of the BTA Parliament in an oathtaking ceremony held in Malacañan Palace on August 12, 2022. ieutenant General Bartolome Vicente Bacarro, Chief of Staff, Armed Forces of the Philippines, visited the Joint Task Force Central and 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division on the morning of September 15, 2022.

Lt. Gen. Bacarro was welcomed by Major General Roy Galido, Commander of JTF Central and 6ID along with other Officers, Enlisted Personnel and staff of the Kampilan Division.

He graduated in the upper quartile of **Philippine Military Academy "Maringal" Class of 1988** and has earned a great extent of awards and recognitions, one of which was the Medal of Valor which was awarded on December 21, 1991 for his **"conspicuous acts of courage, gallantry and intrepidity** at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of **duty" during a 10**-hour encounter with 150 fully-armed New People's Army (NPA) rebels who attacked the town of Maconacon, Isabela on Feberuary 26, 1991.

Lt. Gen. Bacarro also has five (5) Distinguished Service Stars for exemplary service; one Silver Cross Medal; two (2) Bronze Cross Medals for risking life not combat-related; two (2) Silver Wing **Medals; nine (9) Combat Commander's (Kagitingan)** Badges; 36 Military Merit Medals for administrative and combat duties; several Commendations Medals and the Wounded Personnel Medal for wound sustained in combat.

"Clan war greatly affects the peace and order as well as the progress of the province. I am very satisfied to the actions of 6ID including the local government being our partner in crafting solutions to disputing Moro family", the Chief Minister added.

Both BARMM Chief and 6ID Commander expressed their mutual commitment in building peace efforts to ensure inclusive solutions for the interest and welfare of all Bangsamoro.

"There's no point in keeping back to violence like this clan war", MGen. Galido said and who also emphasize that the JTFC supports the BARMM in its endeavor to end clan war and have a peaceful and progressive region.

"Rest assured that the 6ID and JTFC will jointly do our part to achieve peace and development in the province."

MNLF Supports JTFC's peace building efforts



"This is a welcome development for our part as a peacemaker and an agency that ensures security in the AOR to achieve long-term peace and spread socioeconomic progress in the BARMM," MGen. Galido stated.

The 6th Mech Inf Bn is one of the attached units to the 1BCT and is currently commanded by Lieutenant Colonel Ferdinand L Dela Cruz. Gerardo Alvarez, 6th Mechanized **Battalion's Operations Officer, regarding** the AV's capabilities and characteristics.

The new M125A2 with a 120mm Mounted Mortar System will replace the earlier version that is equipped with a earlier version that is equipped with a smaller 81 mm Mounted Mortar System. With its 120-mm Mounted Mortar System complemented by an Advanced Computerized Target Acquisition System as well as its Forward Observation System, the M125A2 will certainly boost the firepower capabilities (specifically indirect fire support) not only of the 6MechBn but of the 1BCT in the conduct of combined arms operations against local of combined arms operations against local terrorists in the area of JTF Central.

"With this latest firepower upgrade, I believe that it will certainly enhance the capabilities of the unit, and it will certainly make a difference on the battlefield."

JTF Central neutralized 326 threat groups

he total number of threat groups neutralized by the Philippine Army's Joint Task Force Central and 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division since January 1st has reached 326.

This is because of the relentless campaign of JTF Central to weed out the enemies of the state who are a threat to the peace and security of Central and South-Central Mindanao and prevent them from sowing violence.


Among the threat groups in the area of operation of JTF Central are the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF), Dawlah Islamiya Turayfe Group (DITG), Armed Lawless Group (ALG) and Communist Terrorist Group (CTG).

Of the aforementioned number, 31 were killed—4 in BIFF, 12 in DITG, 5 in ALG, and 10 in CTG—while 295

5 in ALG, and 10 in CTG—while 295 surrendered to various troops under the line units of the 6ID where they also turned-in their weapons. Of these, 162 came from BIFF, 18 from DITG, 1 from ALG, and 114 were former NPA rebels who return to the folds of law and fully integrate them into mainstream society.

The area of responsibility of the 6ID covers the whole of Maguindanao, including some areas in South Cotabato, Sultan Kudarat, Sarangani, Cotabato, and Lanao del Sur. JTF Central forces were composed of 601st Infantry Brigade, 602nd Infantry Brigade, 603rd Infantry Brigade, 1st Marine Brigade, 6th Field Artillery Battalion, 7th Field Artillery Battalion, and Tactical Operation Group-12.

Major General Roy M Galido, Commander of 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division and Joint Task Force Central said "while we conduct combat operations, we also strengthen our civil-military cooperation as equally important in our efforts with partner stakeholders. We are sustaining our intensified military operation to destroy the remnants of all threat groups and make the area of responsibility of Joint Task Force Central free from terrorists. At the same time, we offer them a peaceful means of laying down their weapons, returning to the folds of the law, and living a **peaceful life with their families.**"

The activity led by Ministry of Public Order and Safety (MPOS) of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao, aimed to promote peace and sustainable development as well as to prevent and counter violent extremism.

Getting to Know You, Highs and Lows; Fundamentals of Conflict, Violence, and Peace; The Islamic Concept of Wasatiyyah (Moderation); Building A Culture of Peace and Tools for Making Peace Work; and many more were among the activities.

MPOS Minister Hussein P. Muñoz emphasized that the activity will look into the factors that lead local insurgents to join violent extremist groups. "It will also identify potential areas where the Bangsamoro government can assist in transforming them into agents of long-term peace and development," MPOS Minister Muñoz said.

It was recalled that most of the participants were the returnees who voluntarily surrendered to the 1st Brigade Combat Team (1BCT) led by their Commander, Colonel Leodivic B Guinid, wherein he insisted **that the use of weapons is not a solution to any problem.** "Let's convey the message of peace to our colleagues and our relatives. Patuloy ang gobyerno sa pagtulong sa inyo sapagkat hindi dahas ang sagot sa paglutas sa problema bagkus dagdag pahirap lamang ang patuloy na paggamit ng armas," Col. Guinid said.

In the aforementioned peace initiatives, the FVEs and the soldiers became friends. 'Friends and not enemies'. This is how the former extremist groups now treat the soldiers they have become acquainted with during the three-day peacebuilding training.

"Kung dati ang mga sundalo ay aming kaaway, pero ngayon kaibigan na namin sila. Ang walang humpay na pagtugis ng tropa ng pamahalaan sa amin, pagod, gutom at sobrang kahirapan ang nagtulak para ako at aking mga kasama ay nagbalik loob na sa pamahalaan", said 'alias Vanguard', who had been a member of the BIFF-Bungos faction for four (4) years before he withdrew his allegiance to the said groups.

The Assistant Division Commander, Brigadier General Eduardo Gubat, was the representative of the 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division and Joint Task Force Central Commander, Major General Roy M Galido. BGen. Gubat stated that "living peacefully with your family is the real victory rather than exerting effort in an armed struggle."

During the closing program, 53 FVEs received financial assistance of P10,000.00 each from MPOS-BARMM.

'Rido' in Pikit, Cotabato due to Land Conflict and not over religion

ajor General Roy M. Galido, Commander of the Joint Task Force Central and 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division clarified that the 'rido' or clan war in Pikit, Cotabato was caused by a protracted land dispute and not a religious conflict.

The clashes trace their roots to the 'land conflict' of 1973 in Brgy. Bualan, Pikit, Cotabato between the Christian community in Sitio Valencia of the said barangay and elements of the 105th MILF base command in Sitio Tubak, Bgy. Pagangan, Aleosan, Cotabato.

According to the report of the 90th Infantry (Bigkis-Lahi) Battalion, the Christian residents of Sitio New Valencia, led by Constantino Wakan, and the members of the 105th Base Command, led by Commander Abdul Rasid Ali alias RP, leader of the MILF 105th Base Command, and Wahid "Kidboy" Mangilen, deputy brigade commander of the 105th BC in Sitio Tubak, are among the groups engaged in hostilities.

The conflict between the two sides sporadically erupted from 1973 until 2017, when it was finally resolved through a "rido" initiative led by the 7IB and the local government of Pikit.

In the said settlement, the team of Commander RP requested for the recovered weapons to be returned to them but the Wacan group opposed, causing strife to re-emerge.

Since then, shooting and ambushing incidents from the two warring groups happened one after another. In just three days in August 2018, seven people were immediately killed due to revenge attacks and the clash intensified even further when armed groups attacked the Christian community in Sitio Valencia. Because of this, the 7IB intervened again by deploying **military forces resulting the war to subdue yet it wasn't a** long-term solution.



In the month of August alone, four (4) people died because of the said rido.

Brigadier General Jovencio F Gonzales, the Commander of the 602nd Brigade insisted that a serious response is needed to the expanding effect of rido in the town of Pikit. "Once again, holding weapons and using violence to solve problems is not a solution, we need dialogue. With the help of the CCCH, the local government of Pikit and the Province of Cotabato, we can find a good solution through peace talks and find out who really owns the disputed land", said BGen. Gonzales.

Meanwhile, MGen Galido said that this is not a religious fight but rather a 'clan war' between two warring groups in the area due to land dispute. "Right now, we are laying out the long-term solution and there is a need for the community in the area to see solutions based on the rule of law, said the Division Commander.

"There is nothing good that the rido can bring to us but the continued struggle of families over racial depletion without obtaining justice," said MGen. Galido.

5 NPA SURRENDER TO 7 IB

n August 26, 2022, five (5) NPA members of SRC DAGUMA surrendered with their firearms to the 7th Infantry (TAPAT) Battalion, 6th Infantry (KAMPILAN) Division at Headquarters 7IB, Brgy Kapaya, Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat.

Along with the five (5) Former Rebels are their firearms with ammunition and some explosive paraphernalia. The former rebels were formally presented to Lieutenant Colonel Frederick M. Chicote, Commanding Officer of 7IB; Police Colonel Tom P. Tuzon, Provincial Director, SKPPO; Ms. Michelle P. Peniero, RSW Officer II of DSWD XII; and Mr. John Lebiga, E-CLIP Focal Person of PSWDO-SK.

ife has to end. Love doesn't." This adage encapsulates the 57th Infantry (Masikap) Battalion Warriors' genuine virtue of love for comrades in arms, including enemies.

The 57IB once again showed its fairness and empathy by facilitating the decent and proper burial in honor of the late lan Dela Rama, alias Chris, commanding officer of the regional operations command of the rebels' Far South Mindanao Region (FSMR) who was killed during a legitimate encounter that transpired in Baluan, Palimbang, Sultan Kudarat last July 30th, 2022.

Despite public notice, no one claimed his remains. According to Lt. Col. Guillermo T Mabute, Commanding Officer, 57IB a proper interment of the **CTG's remains was successfully held at the Baluan Public** Cemetery on August 6, 2022, through the collaborative efforts of the government troops from the 603rd Infantry Brigade, Palimbang LGU, Palimbang MPS, and Baluan BPOC.

> Colonel Michael Santos, Commander of the 603rd Infantry (Persuader) Brigade, said the four successive

armed encounters resulted in the killing of Ian Dela Rama alias Cris, a commanding officer of the regional operations command of the Far South Mindanao Region. He was also a former secretary of Front 4A, North Central Mindanao Regional Committee from May 2018 to May 2019. Rama has an existing warrant of arrest with criminal case # 23022 for arson, filed at Branch 3 in Butuan City.

"Also neutralized in the gun fights were Valerio Lacumbo with aliases as Bitoy, Bobit, and Delfin with an existing warrant of arrest with criminal case # 568-2007 for robbery with violence against or intimidation of a person filed in a local court at Kidapawan City and Wilmer Dela Cruz alias Dodong/Grab, a member of Dabu-Dabu Platoon of the South Regional Command of Daguma, Far South Mindanao Region," Col. Santos said.

Government troops were able to recover two (2) M16A1 Rifles, one (1) Garand Rifle, two (2) Caliber 45 Pistols, one (1) Hand Grenade, one (1) long and one (1) short magazine for the M16, three (3) magazines for the Caliber 45 pistol, ammunition, eleven (11) assorted keypad cell phones, five (5) pieces of flash drives, cash amounting to three thousand and thirty pesos (P3,030.00), assorted sim cards, assorted medicines, two (2) bandoliers, power bank, and other war materials.





5 BIFF members yields in Cotabato Province

ive (5) more lawless armed men renounced on Wednesday their membership with the outlawed BIFF-Karialan Faction and pledged allegiance to the government bringing their firearms and high explosives during a simple presentation held at the Headquarters of 602nd Infantry (Liberator) Brigade in Camp Lucero, Barangay Poblacion, Carmen, Cotabato morning of July 20, 2022.

According to Lieutenant Colonel Rommel Mundala, Battalion Commander of 90th Infantry (Bigkis Lahi) Battalion, the said endeavor was a joint effort of the government troops, community, and the local government.

"The said members of the BIFF – Karialan Faction wanted now to renew their lives by living in a peaceful community", Lt. Col. Mundala said.

They turned - over their two Garand Rifles, two M14 Sniper Rifles, and one 60mm Mortar.

Alias Rodin said his group had been tired of fighting the government and running away from air and ground attacks of government forces.

"We ought to thank the LGU for helping convince them to return to mainstream society," BGen. Gonzales said.

Major General Roberto Capulong, 6ID and JTF Central Acting Commander is calling to other remaining members of the said terror group to yield and embrace the peaceful living in their community. "I call on other BIFF out there to consider the reconciliation program of the government," Maj. Gen. Capulong pleaded.

The surrenderers will get a livelihood package from the government.

5th Special Forces Battalion and LGU T'boli join hand in upholding peace

he 5th Special Forces Battalion (5SFBn) of the 1st Mechanized Infantry (Reliable) Brigade is working hand in hand with the local government of T'boli in the province of South Cotabato about initiatives to help free the town from terrorist control. As a result, many former members of the movement surrendered to the 5SFBn troops and reunited with their families. They also given up their weapons along with their surrender.

On July 24, 2022, a resident of Sitio Desikit, Barangay Laconon, Tboli, South Cotabato surrendered along with his 5.56mm M16A1 rifle and .38 revolver. The weapons surrendered are indeed the property of a specific Communist Terrorist Group, Sub-Region Operation Command, GF MUSA, Far-South Mindanao Region, led by a certain Bambam.

With the established close collaboration, residents of Barangay Laconon in Tboli were instrumental in facilitating the surrender of Ricky Lumbay, alias Jeric, 20 years old, resident of Kiamba, Sarangani, bringing with him his caliber 5.56 M16A1 carbine rifle on January 31.

Furthermore, on August 16, 2022, two members of Milisyang Bayan (MB) under Guerilla Front Musa, FSMR surrendered to the 5th SFBn as a result of the sustained combat operations in South Cotabato in support of the National Task Force Ending Local Communist Armed Conflict's peace, law enforcement, and development support cluster implementation (NTF -ELCAC). The surrenderers, whose real names were withheld for security reasons and who went by the aliases Rondick and Regen, were residents of T'Boli's barangays Lamhako and Sinolon. The two surrendered one (1) caliber.30 M1 Springfield Garand rifle with three clips of ammunition, one (1) caliber.45 Colt pistol, and one (1) hand grenade. Specifically, they eagerly want to surrender, "Hindi kami makatulog sa gabi dahil iniisip namin kung ano ang puwedeng masamang mangyari sa amin sa gabi kung hindi pa kami magsusurrender. Pinili naming magsurrender na pati ang mga armas na tinatago namin mabuhay na kasama ang pamilya namin," alias Rondick, said.

Similarly, based on the surrendered individuals' revelations, the recent neutralization of Ariel Lasib, alias Jenrose, the 2nd Deputy Secretary of the CTGs' Guerilla Front Musa by the 5th Special Forces Battalion last April 8, and the sustained focused military operations of the 1st Mechanized Infantry (Maaasahan) Brigade led by its commander, Brigadier General Pedro Balisi, Jr. The declaration of persona non grata by the T'Boli Local Government under Mayor Keo Dayle T. Tuan against the Communist NPA Terrorists had a significant impact and pushed them to surrender.

Finally, all of this was made possible by the efforts of Mayor Keo Dayle Tuan, who has consistently stated that his priorities include the promotion of agricultural, ecological, and cultural development in his municipality. Tboli LGU has been providing incentives and immediate cash assistance to CNT surrenderers as part of their enhanced comprehensive local integration program (E-CLIP) since October 2021, and has urged the Tboli tribe to encourage CNTs to surrender in order to put an end to CNT IP exploitation.

No let-up operation led 8 communist terrorists to surrender

ight (8) members of the communist terrorist group (CTG) yielded to government troops including their weapons which consisted of an automatic rifle, high explosives, and shotgun during a presentation held at the 7th Infantry (TAPAT) Battalion in Barangay Masiag, Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat morning of July 20, 2022.

According to Lieutenant Colonel Frederick Chicote, Battalion Commander of 7IB "the said personalities were remnants of South Regional Command, Daguma, Far South Mindanao Region (FSMR) who have now had a major setback in their ranks due to the surrender of their members. They withdraw their allegiance to the CPP-NPA terrorist group", said Lt. Col. Chicote.

"The former communist combatants also want to clear their names to live normal lives in their community", Lt. Col. Chicote added.

They turned over their firearms consisting of two (2) rifles 5.56mm M16, one (1) rifle Cal. 30 M1 carbine, two (2) KG9 & one Ingram, and one (1) M79 with three (3) 40mm high explosives, one (1) High Explosive, command-detonated explosives (CDX) and one 12-Gauge Shotgun with several magazines and ammunition. Colonel Michael Santos, 603rd Infantry Brigade Commander said that based on the revelation of

Commander said that based on the revelation of surrendered persons, they decided to surrender and return to the folds of the law because of the no let-up focused military operations in the area.

"The relentless operation of the troops resulted in their significant loss not only in terms of manpower but also on their mass base which made them on the **run and experienced hunger, tired and discomfort**", **Col.** Santos added.

One of the surrenderers said that he was happy that they were given the chance to change their lives and correct the mistake they have committed due to the deception of the CPP-NPA.

"Biktima rin kami ng mga kasinungalingan at panlilinlang ng CPP-NPA. Gusto namin ng kapayapaan. Ang CPP-NPA ay naghahasik ng takot at lagim sa komunidad at ito ang isa sa aming mga dahilan para sumuko sa mga awtoridad," he said.





Army troops recover CTG's war materials after clashes in Sultan Kudarat

n anti-personnel mine was recovered including several war materiel and ammunition after a brief firefight of government security forces against more or less 15 Communist Terrorist Group (CTG) members in Barangay Baluan, Palimbang, Sultan Kudarat Province Friday afternoon (July 29, 2022).

The government troops overrun the harbor site and recovered one (1) anti-personnel mine, galvanometer, backpack, 30 meters wire, 88 rounds of 7.62 mm ammunition, subversive documents, and several personal belongings from the CTG.

Colonel Michael Santos, Brigade Commander of 603rd Infantry Brigade said the soldiers were conducting combat clearing operations at the said place of the incident and were encountered by CTG under alias Rayray, an intel officer of FSMR.

"The firefight lasted for about 20 minutes. After which, the enemy scampered into different directions while the troops immediately conducted pursuit operations to the fleeing enemy", Col. Santos said.

Major General Roberto Capulong, Acting Commander of the Joint Task Force Central and 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division lauded the engaging infantrymen that made another major setback to the remaining CTGs in South-Central Mindanao.

Similarly, Maj. Gen. Capulong reiterated the call to the remaining members of the CTGs who are still hiding in the hinterlands to return to mainstream society and stop wasting their lives on a misguided ideology that will eventually result in their demise.

"You still have time to heed the call of reconciliation, return to the folds of the law and be back to the mainstream of society. The JTF Central and 6ID, together with the local government units through the Enhanced Comprehensive Local Integration Program (E-CLIP), will assist and help you to start anew. Take the chance to start a peaceful and harmonious life with your family and loved ones," the Division Commander pleaded.

Communist Terrorist Group Continuously Collapses

hree (3) more communist terrorists who have returned to the folds of the law have admitted that the communist organization under the subregional command of Daguma is on the brink of collapse.

The three, who belonged to the Platoon Madrid of the West Daguma Front, SRC Daguma of Far South Mindanao Region, operating in the hinterlands of Sultan Kudarat, surrendered and yielded their high-powered firearms to the 37th Infantry (Conqueror) Battalion in Brgy. Tibpuan, Lebak, Sultan Kudarat on Wednesday morning, August 24, 2022.

Among those who surrendered were a 38-yearold man alias "Dok," a 29-year-old female medic, and a political guide alias "CJ," a 31-year-old with battle orders.

They surrendered two (2) 5.56mm M16A1 rifles.

ndigenous people in Kalamansig, Sultan Kudarat, are grateful for medical and dental outreach programs conducted by various branches of government and the private sectors.

"We now feel better about the service that the government provides to us," said one of the Manobo-Dulangan tribe's leaders. "Even though our place is far away, they still go to deliver this service to our natives."

About 589 people benefited from the aforementioned program, mostly natives and the indigent availed outreach programs such as medical check-ups, dental services, circumcision, free haircuts, and many others. It was carried out in different areas of Sitio Maat, Brgy. Sangay, as well as Sitio Alaska, Brgy. Sabanal, all in Kalamansig from August 2-3, 2022.

"I appreciate the vitamins and medication I received. This program has also been used to check the health status of my mother. Thank you very much to LGU Kalamansig and the Assembly of God Church Medical Team for this endeavor," one of the program's beneficiaries said.

"This program is our response with the government's duty to look at and determine the condition of those at the grassroot of society and provide them with appropriate services such as health," Hon. Joaquin Concha, the town's mayor, stated.

Our troops from the 37th Infantry Brigade, led by Lt. Col. John Paul Baldomar, and the 603rd Brigade, led by Colonel Michael Santos, are also actively involved in this outreach program. The activity was in response to the needs of the residents of barangay Tukanalipao who were severely affected and forced to evacuate due to the recent attack of the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF) under Abdulkarim Lumbatan Hasim alias Boy Jacket and Muslimin Amilil alias Mus on the community and detachment of 33IB situated in the area.

To help the IDPs, the unit collaborated for the delivery of health services and assistance with the Integrated Provincial Health Office (IPHO), Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO) of Maguindanao, Barangay Local Government Unit of Tukanalipao, Bureau of Fire Protection, and Municipal Police of Mamasapano. The clients, with a total number of 317, availed the following services: consultation, tooth extraction, circumcision, and distribution of medicine and reading glasses. The 400 relief packs were distributed by the PDRRMO to the residents of barangay Tukanalipao while the troops of 33rd IB provided free haircuts aside from security and assisted the medical/dental team in providing health services.

Moreover, Ms. Nor Eimman Balayman, Focal Person of the Province of Maguindanao, initiated a short dialogue to convince the displaced persons to peacefully go back to their respective houses. Right after the activity, families returned to their houses and attended to their normal lives.

Inadequate services and assistance in situations like this are commonly exploited by terrorist groups to discredit the government and its agencies. However, through the delivery of services at barangay Tukanalipao, the false narratives of the terrorist groups are thwarted while the government gains the trust and confidence of the residents.

The 33IB believes that cooperation among the people of the community and different government agencies is an important ingredient in achieving peace and prosperity in the province of Maguindanao.

KWENTONG PAGBABAGO!

"The old has gone, the new has come."

un! Run! ... Hurry Up...! Siyakaren pagagayas ka talagoy ka!!! Boom!!! After hearing a loud explosion not far from my side, I noticed that my fellow

was bleeding and dying, and my hearing had not yet recovered from the deafening blast of the mortar in our fort. My resistance, however, persisted. I wanted to save my wounded comrade, but I couldn't because the soldiers who continued to advance on our position were so strong that I was forced to abandon my bloody pal. Nevertheless, I also fired at the soldiers who were chasing us until I was able to completely escape from them. I ran quickly to avoid being followed. Even though the forest was dense and the path was mountainous and difficult, I didn't stop running to get away from them. When I got away from the pursuing soldiers and heard no more shots, I stopped running because I knew the soldiers couldn't catch up to me because I was far away from them. I had to stop running due to exhaustion. I hadn't even realized that my companions had gone. I was so exhausted and hungry from running away from the soldiers. Because I was so tired, I didn't realize I'd fallen asleep. I drifted off to a massive tree that had served as my protection and hideout for a few days.

These are just some of the incidents that 'Alyas Vanguard' experienced when he was still an active member of the Freedom Fighters, also known as the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF). In 2008, Ameril Umbra Kato left the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF) group because he did not agree with the MILF's acceptance of autonomy rather than full independence. This happened after the Philippine Supreme Court negated the Memorandum of Agreement on Ancestral Domain signed by the Philippine government and the MILF. Kato led a group of fighters and founded the BIFF in December 2010. He said that he has 5,000 fighters, but the government says he only has 300. In August 2011, the MILF identified Kato's group as a break-away group and declared the BIFF a "lost command".

Alyas Vanguard is an Uztadz who teaches children lessons about the Islamic religion. He is married and has children living peacefully in their community in Maguindanao. But his life situation changed after he joined the freedom fighters. At first, he was only invited to teach the Islamic religion. His food was free, as was his fare to go to the place where the BIFFs were gathering and collecting additional forces. He didn't realize that the BIFF gradually indoctrinated him to become a radical and converted him into an extremist individual.

In 2018, he formally joined the extremist group and became a member of BIFF. They have no formal training within their organization except for handling guns.

"We are not required to go through intensive training as long as you know how to use a firearm as well as how to assemble and disassemble your weapon," Alias Vanguard explained further. They were taught how to hold and shoot a firearm for twelve hours. They were also shown how to clean their weapons properly. After that, they would eventually become regular members of the liberation movement.

Since then, his world has become uneasy, meaning he can no longer freely go to the places he used to visit. It has also come to the point that even his entire family has become supporters of BIFF. His situation

became extremely difficult as the hours, days, months, and years passed by. He was no longer able to provide for his family. Instead, he became a burden to his family because they were the ones who supported him.

While inside the movement, new recruits, including alias Vanguard, are still being taught the five pillars of Islam, where they also pray five times a day. Until Jihad was also instilled in their minds, according to him, being a mujahideen was a defender of the oppressed. It is a Muslim's struggle or **efforts in God's way who fights on behalf of the faith or the Muslim community** (ummah). It is said that they are taught to defend their fellow Muslims from those who really want to encroach on their rights. So, even if there is no support in their organization, they can bear it for the sake of the cause. Alias Vanguard revealed that he spends his own money and earnings to finance the purchase of ammunition rather than support it for his family.

One of the most painful experiences he went through while he was still in the armed struggle was when his son got sick and he could not get close to him and brought him to the hospital for treatment. He lamented the bitterness that had overtaken him. Perhaps he would not be able to forgive himself if something bad happened to a member of his family. It was at this point that he realized that what he was fighting for would be futile if he couldn't care for his family members.

"It came to the point that I could no longer bear my suffering and I also felt sorry for my family's condition. I see that the government has a good program for returnees like me. That's why I didn't hesitate to return to the folds of the law and withdraw my allegiance to this extremist group – BIFF, and hand over my weapon to the state forces, alias "Vanguard" jubilantly said. As a result, alias Vanguard was given the opportunity to be reunited with his family. "Right now, I'm absolutely happy because I can spend time with my family. I had already guided my sons' and daughters' growth, and I was once again with my beloved wife, where we were after all untied from the chains of the nightmare in our lives by joining the armed struggle that would not bring anything good to my family's future," the narration of alias Vanguard.

From August 21-23, 2022, alias Vanguard was one of 53 former violent extremists who participated in a three-day peacebuilding training held in Brgy. Badak, Datu Odin Sinsuat, Maguindanao, initiated by the Ministry of Public Order and Safety (MPOS) of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao, which aims to promote peace and sustainable development as well as to prevent and counter violent extremism. They also received financial assistance from the government. During such training, they were taught that the solution to any problem is not violence or the use of weapons, but rather proper dialogue and peace negotiations. He narrated that it was only during the said training that he and his colleagues were able to eat delicious food and sleep in a nice and soft bed. Moreover, living free is better than carrying a twisted idealism, and continuing on with an armed struggle against the government is a futile cause.

It will be remembered that the soldiers were once our enemies, but now they are our friends. They are already my friends, and they are assisting me in our training. He reiterated that the soldiers are with them in promoting peace. In this regard, alias Vanguard has a call to his colleagues who continue to be stubborn and still do not want to accept the government's peace offer. My only message to my fellows who are still embracing this twisted idealism and continuing this armed struggle is to accept the peace offer from our government. Our authorities and our state forces are here to support us in our return to mainstream society. When we submit to the government, we will be provided a means of support and financial assistance to begin a new life. I am just one of the many living witnesses that it is good to live with our loved ones with freedom, letting go of the old toil. The old has gone, the new has come.

KWENTONG DUGONG Kampilan: Central Mindanao's Combat Ace and Marksman

oining the Armed Forces is a challenging profession. As they say when you are in the military service, "You're one foot is in the grave," which implies your life is in danger or you are about to offer a supreme sacrifice in order to defend the sovereignty of this country. However, this is not a

deterrent for a military man to display his bravery in the field of warfare. Another Kampilan trooper has once again proven his gallantry in the line of duty and in defending the populace from enemies who seek to undermine the cherished peace and tranquility that everyone values in Central Mindanao.

One of them is Technical Sergeant Joel L. Tuganan, 846688 (Inf) PA, assigned to the 33rd Infantry (Makabayan) Battalion under the mother unit of the 6th Infantry (Kampilan) Division, who demonstrated his gallantry and was once more placed at the highest echelon of victory for the 6ID as well as the entire ranks of the Armed Forces of the Philippines after he was named this year's (2022) "The Outstanding Philippine Soldier" (TOPS) by the Metrobank Foundation.

Who is TSg Tuganan, and why did the Metrobank Foundation recognize him? Let's take a look at his story here in the KWENTONG TAGUMPAY, dubbed "DUGONG Kampilan: Central Mindanao's Combat Ace and Marksman."

TSg Tuganan worked as a construction laborer while still a student in high school and college. He also worked as a waiter in Zamboanga prior to joining the military, where he served as a utility for Task Force Zamboanga's S2 Section from 2000 to 2003. Since TSg Tuganan was a private, only 33IB served as his unit until now, first in Sultan Kudarat, then in Jolo, Sulu, Lanao Del Sur, and currently in Maguindanao. He was a member of Taskforce Yolanda when Typhoon Yolanda wreaked havoc in Tacloban City and the province of Leyte.

What he will never forget from his past experiences during combat operations are missions where some of his colleagues put their lives in danger and lost them in the midst of the battle that turned into nightmares for him. He revealed that he had colleagues whom he had saved while engaged in combat with armed groups, but it was also painful for him to see one of his companions dying or bleeding heavily, like in Jolo, Sulu, where the operations take place one after the other. Meanwhile, during the said encounter, even their officer was hit by a bullet. He even managed to drag his wounded officer to safety, but later he was unable to do so because of the attackers' unyielding assault of fire on their position, where his wounded officer was suffering from the severity of his wounds. TSg Tuganan disclosed that during the aforementioned engagement, some members of his fire team were KIA, or Killed in Action, where his squad teams nearly perished because they were being surrounded by the Abu Sayyaf. He also had a similar experience when they engaged in combat with MILF Lost Command members in the mountains of Lanao del Sur. "However, when we have wounded colleagues, we do 'care under fire', like the encounter we had before in the mountains of Isulan, Sultan Kudarat, where I saved the life of



Sgt. Endario of the 62nd DRC through first aid," he added. On the other hand, in the secluded village of Tukanalipao, Maguindanao, he saved the life of Cpl. Cabildo. Even though they were surrounded by the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF), he still did not hesitate to treat and save his wounded pal in the midst of battle. In such a case, his two naked eyes once again witnessed the death of another of his fellow soldiers who offered their lives as a supreme sacrifice for the sake of the desired peace in Central Mindanao during the said bloody clashes, for whom the nightmares of the past came flooding back to him in the midst of encounters in Liguasan Marsh.

Because of his exemplary performance as a courageous soldier and peace advocate in his duty to his country, TSg. Tuganan was nominated and recommended by his current and former officers to participate in being honored by a prestigious organization—the Metrobank Foundation—that bestows awards on deserving and outstanding Filipinos in the area of "The Outstanding Philippine Soldier" (TOPS). According to him, he was given a recommendation by Colonel Harold Cabunoc, who was his former Battalion Commander in the 33rd IB and who is also a recipient of the same award. His former Battalion Commanders, Col. Ricky Bunayog and Col. Elmer Boongaling, who are also TOPS Awardees, gave him support during the preliminary interviews through final board interviews. Additionally, he expresses gratitude to his current Battalion Commander, Lt. Col. Benjamin Cadiente Jr., and their Personnel Officer, Cpt. Carlito Christopher Agustin, who extended help for his requirements and focused on his itinerary for monitoring as well as rehearsals for the interview and other preparations he made. He prepared for the elimination, semifinal, and final board interviews in order to be given the mentioned award from the private sector. The panelists consisted of the judges, the senator serving as chairman, and the CEO of the private company. Professionals from various ranks, including public school teachers, the Philippine National Police, the Philippine Air Force, the Philippine Navy, and the Philippine Marines, also underwent the meticulous process. His accomplishments in combat, administration as a training NCO/Instructor, and community service became TSg Tuganan's key and winning formula to obtain the said award.

Nonetheless, despite reaching this pinnacle of success, he cited his family, his entire 33IB comrades, whom he referred to as his "tropang Makabayan," and the troops who made the ultimate sacrifice for their countrymen as his inspiration for winning the once-in-a-lifetime award. According to TSg Tuganan, it is a great honor for enlisted personnel **like him to be given a reward because it's demonstrated that an NCO like him can partake in this kind of competition in** which nothing is insurmountable for someone with a dream and a strong will. For those who also aspire to receive this distinction, he emphasized that they should only obey the legal orders of the officers and senior NCOs and think of good ways and solutions wholeheartedly for the good of the organization. He added that it is not bad to volunteer when you know that it is a great help for the community, the people, and the organization of the Philippine Army. He added that helping others and showing respect to fellow soldiers, especially the civilians around him, are just some of the great lessons he learned that should be lived. TSg Tuganan first of all thanks the great creator, his family, relatives, and the entire troops of the 6th Infantry (KAMPILAN) Division, especially the Officers, former Commanders, and Senior NCOs who fully support and trust the enlisted personnel and the civilian supporters who really love the Armed Forces of the Philippines.

TSg. Tuganan was born in Baliwasan, Zamboanga City, and now lives with his loving wife and three children in Brgy. Talinga, Leon B. Postigo, Zamboanga del Norte. While his wife was three months pregnant, they are only two siblings, and his older brother died on July 21, 2022, due to a hemorrhage, and both of his parents are deceased. TSg Tuganan is currently the first sergeant of Delta Company, 33rd Infantry Battalion of 6ID, PA and their battalion is stationed in Radja Buayan, Maguindanao, BARMM.

"Take care of the service entrusted to us by the government because this is the source of our family's "bread and butter" and continue to be of service to the entire Filipino people," the statement from the so-**called Central Mindanao's** Combat Ace and Marksman said.

Redskin Participates in Bloodletting



WHY REVIVE THE MANDATORY ROTC?

"ROTC will be good for millennials. It will inculcate discipline, teach them to respect authorities/elders and strengthen PATRIOTISM." - Sen. JV Ejercito

Having a reserve force in one's country's armed forces gives its citizens a sense of security during an emergency or a big disaster. Therefore, one of every citizen's basic duties is to protect and defend their country. It should be acknowledged as a responsibility and a duty. The Philippines' ability to mount a credible defense or to start deployment in times of national emergencies to reinforce the organic and active military units of the Armed Forces of the Philippines has unfortunately weakened since the enactment of Republic Act No. 7077.

It would be beneficial, in my opinion, to reinstate the ROTC program in schools. This program for our youth might very well benefit not only our country's security issues, but also every community. Discipline can also be taught here. With social media and modern times, our young people's interests and views are changing, so we should train them through this program on the importance of contributing to our country's defense using their respective skills and abilities.

Having myself experienced Citizen Army Training (CAT) in high school and a Reserved Officer Training Course (ROTC) in college, I firmly believe that requiring ROTC is appropriate and beneficial. First, it inculcates discipline and personal responsibility among young people. Unfortunately, these values, I think, are lacking in many of our youth. Second, it fosters patriotism and love for the country, which could develop into a willingness to defend the country from invaders, both foreign and local. Third, there are skills to learn in an ROTC course. To name a few things that I learned from ROTC: first aid, compass guided navigation, rappelling, and firearms disassembling and assembling. ROTC mandates have a great impact, especially on the Filipino youth. It would be very beneficial as it promotes values and discipline.
